

	<b>Dinner speaker Rob McGavin</b> <i>Boundary Bend Olives</i> Rob McGavin and Paul Riordan established Boundary Bend Olives in 1997, with the first trees planted in 1999. Boundary Bend is now a fully vertically-integrated olive oil producer which propagates and establishes the trees, grows the olives, harvests and processes the fruit into oil before bottling. From its own olive groves Boundary Bend Olives produces approximately 70% of Australia's olive oil and has about 80% of the sales of Australian extra virgin olive oil.
